UK Carbon Emissions in 2000

- · Buildings contribute 50% of UK carbon emissions
- 75 million tonnes · Buildings:

 - » 40 domestic » 35 non domestic

30% of these emissions from electricity


- * 45% motor drives (fans & pumps)
 * 30% electricity
 * 20% lighting
 * 5% heating

- Transport:

40 million tonnes

How can we do better?

- Set minimum standards
 Government should set minimum targets on energy/water/waste/carbon emissions
 Example of Merton Borough Council

 Ecological foot printing




How can we do better?


- Must have education so everyone aware of issues and how to construct & use buildings sustainably

 - eco renovation vital


